Retelling Guides

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A Retelling Guide is a written set of prompts that can be used in an interview or conference setting of teacher to student or student to student.

Rationale

This is a synthesis or assessment strategy that can be used cooperatively involving listening and speaking, across content areas.

Instructional Procedures

- Select the text or viewing material that is to be used as the source of the retelling.
- 2. I dentify key points or events of the material.
- Prepare a written prompt or guide reflecting essential items that could be retold.
- 4. Have students read, hear or view the material.
- 5. Overview the retelling guide with the students serving as the recorder/listener.
- 6. Place students with partners for guided retelling interaction.
- 7. Have recorder provide feedback to the student teller.

Helpful Hints

A guide can be general by using the story map that is provided in the

following pages, or by providing text specific prompts/questions.

Each time a story is read, a teacher can conference with two students at a time by guiding them through a retelling and saving the results in their portfolio. This works well with younger students.
